The 9-month tenure track position consists of administrative and teaching responsibilities with additional paid summer responsibilities. The Chair is responsible for the management of all departmental operations and represents the department in official capacities. The Chair is expected to provide leadership toward the achievement of excellence in teaching, scholarship, and service activities in the department.

Requirements:

Applicants should have a terminal degree in education from an accredited institution, with a preference for a degree from an institution with an NCATE/CAPE accredited program. Preference will be given to qualified applicants who can teach/research in multiple areas of need and who possess professional level educational leadership certification and have school leadership experience. The selected applicants will be expected to teach at both the graduate and undergraduate levels. Face-to-face and online teaching are both expected. Candidates will be expected to produce scholarship at a level consistent with NCATE/CAPE Scholarly Academic standards and the standards of the LSU system.
