Important Dates

Abstract Submission: November 1, 2007

Notification of acceptance: December 17, 2007

Submission of full papers for the Conference Proceedings (see our website for the guidelines): March 15, 2008

Procedures for Abstract Submissions

First, submit an abstract describing your presentation. The submission should include: title, name of author(s), email address, institution, mailing address, and an abstract for oral and poster presentations (250 words) or symposium presentations (150 words for the objective(s) of the symposium and 250 words for each paper in the symposium). Each submission must be accompanied by the ISSWOV Abstract Submission Form. Send all submissions as email attachments to ISSWOV2008@ut.edu. The header of the email message should be entitled "ISSWOV Submission".

Authors of accepted submissions will then be asked to complete the registration form (which will be found on the ISSWOV website) and submit the full paper for the proceedings. In case of multiple authors, only the submitter will be notified. The submitter is responsible for notifying his or her co-authors.

Once your submission has been accepted for presentation, you must register for the conference in order to present. Your presentation time and program schedule will be emailed to you prior to the conference.

Guidelines for Abstract Submission

Oral and Poster Presentations: Abstracts should be submitted as an attachment in Word prepared in the following format.

Symposium Presentations: Proposals should be submitted as an attachment in Word prepared in the following format.

- The abstract should be 150 words. It should be single spaced, with 1” margins on all sides.
- The abstract should include the objective(s) of the symposium.
- There may be 3 or 4 papers in a Symposium.
- Each email should contain one submission.
- Each submission must be accompanied by the ISSWOV Abstract Submission Form.

For Papers in the Symposium (up to 4; each on a separate page)
