

SPECIAL EDUCATION

The baccalaureate degree program in Special Education is undergoing re-design as required by the Board of Regents during the 2004-2005 academic year. Therefore, we have no undergraduate degree program in Special Education at this time. A student who wishes to add Special Education as an endorsement to a teaching certificate in Elementary or Secondary Education may do so by completing the following additional twelve or fifteen semester hours:

- ❖ ED 302: *Teaching Pupils with Learning and Behavior Problems* (3 credits)
- ❖ ED 303: *Teaching Basic Subjects to Mildly and Moderately Handicapped Pupils* (3 credits)
- ❖ ED 386: *Special Education Diagnostics Practicum* (3 credits)
- ❖ ED 409: *Vocational and Transition Services for Students with Disabilities* (3 credits)
- ❖ ED 387: *Practicum in Assessment and Evaluation* (3 credits). *This course would NOT be required if the student participates in a student teaching experience which combines regular and special education teaching experiences.
