***Proposal to Amend Article VI, Section A (1) of the SGA Bylaws to Change the Meeting Time of the Student Senate***

**Be it known**, that the SGA Student Senate currently meets weekly during noon on Friday afternoons;

**Whereas**, the

- (1) This time period is not effective for gathering quorum;
- (2) Other student organizations meet during this time causing conflicts for Senators.

**Whereas**, a meeting time of Thursday during common hour break time (10:30-11:15 am) would allow for a more efficient period for business to be accomplished in the SGA Student Senate and would be a time period that would have less conflicts for Senators involved with other student organizations;

**Whereas**, the meeting time for the SGA Student Senate is set forth in Article VI, Section A (1) of the SGA bylaws;

**Whereas**, a proposal to amend the Bylaws must be approved by a three-fourths (3/4) vote of the Senate; then therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Senate of the LSUS SGA vote to approve this Proposal to amend ARTICLE VI, Section A (1) of the SGA Bylaws in order to change the meeting time for the Student Senate to common hour break time (10:30-11:15 am) on Thursdays;

Regular Senate meetings will be on ***Fridays*** Thursdays beginning at approximately ***noon*** 10:30am and ending no later than 45 minutes after the meeting has been called to order, except on holidays and summer sessions. Regular meeting times will be noted in the intent to run forms filed by senatorial candidates.
