3 Takeways From the Recent Campus Security Incident

During a recent Q&A with Chief Donald Wray, the Safety Guy asked him for a few " takeaways" from the recent security incident involving an ex student. Here is a summary of his response:

- 1. Vigilance—always be alert for things that just don't seem right. Do not be bashful in reporting unusual behavior or activity
- 2. Precaution—be prepared before the crisis hits. Make sure you install Rave Guardian on your mobile devices and check for updates on a regular basis
- 2. Communication— Critical at all levels before, during, and after an emergency situation

Need to Drive on university business...here's how to become an "Authorized Driver"

1) Please review the Authorized Driver memo: Authorized Driver Memo

2) Authorized Drivers must take the online driver safety training. <u>Link To Driver Safety Training</u> Make sure to print your certificate.

3) Complete the <u>Driver Safety Form</u>. The completed authorized driver form and the certificate from the driver safety training should both be faxed to Campus Police at 797-5161.

4) Those who travel with their personal vehicle and wish to be reimbursed for mileage must also submit a copy of their personal vehicle insurance as well.

Driving records will be reviewed by the Chief of University Police, and upon approval, drivers will be added to the "Authorized Drivers' List."
