

LSU Shreveport, 2012-13 Fact Book Executive Summary

The switch to a Fact Book instead of the traditional Data Profiles was implemented in 2012 for several reasons: to bring LSU Shreveport into alignment with other institutions' publications, to provide useful and meaningful data to all campus constituents, and to provide the information in a simple presentation that was easy to understand by all. Documented below are some of the important trends recognized from this data.

Enrollment Trends at LSUS

Fall enrollment at LSUS has remained consistent within the last 3 years -approximately 4500 students. This number has seen an increase since the mid-2000's where enrollment hovered at around 4300 students. Summer enrollments have dropped significantly within the last two years. Since 2010 there has been an approximate 25% decrease in the number of students attending during this term. The majority of our students, approximately 84%, continue to be represented from the Shreveport Metropolitan Service area (Caddo, Bossier, DeSoto, and Webster parishes). This percentage of students has remained consistent for the last nine years. The total number of Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) students has decreased by nine percent in the past four years, probably accounted for by the large increase in dual-enrolled students taking less than a full-time load. The diversity of the student population has remained consistent over the past seven years - approximately 65% White, 21% Black, and 14% other minority or unknown.

Enrollment Trends by School and Program

A snap-shot look at the 25 current degree programs offered at LSUS during the 2012-13 academic year shows a consistent percentage of overall market share for all degree programs. Two programs have shown growth in the last three years; Community Health, and Fine Arts. Another area of significant growth has been realized within the dual-enrollment program. Since 2008, the number of students participating in this program has risen by 160%. At the Graduate level a new degree program, Biological Sciences was added in 2012 and had an initial enrollment of 13 students. Growth was also seen in two graduate programs: Curriculum & Instruction, M.Ed., and Human Services Administration, M.S.

Enrollment Trends within the State and LSU System

Enrollment at the State's 4-year institutions has been relatively stagnant or negative over the past four years; however, enrollment at 2-year institutions increased significantly within the same time period. For example, Bossier Parish Community College has increased enrollment 45% in the last four years. Enrollment at the schools within the LSU System has seen an overall increase over the previous year, and a continued increase over the past four years. Of all the schools in the state, LSUS has seen the largest percent change in growth in enrollment over the past five years (5.7%).

Student Performance Profiles

Graduation rates of First-Time, Full-Time students at LSUS have increased significantly over the past four years. The 2006 cohort (latest available data) have set the highest graduation rate, 30.4%, in the history of LSUS. The total number of completers has fluctuated from year-to-year; however, there has been a steady overall increase in the number of completers at the Master's level in the last ten years. Since the first graduating class at LSUS, over 18,000 degrees have been awarded.

Personnel Profiles

Faculty and staff numbers continue to decrease as state-funding for higher education has diminished. Although the number of faculty has decreased, the percent that hold a terminal degree, and the percent that are tenured has remained consistent over the past five years. The staff have also seen significant reductions in positions. The hardest hit area being the secretarial/clerical classification, down 26% over the last three years.






Chart to Show Enrollment in LSU System Schools 2008-12


