Support and Resources for Survivors of DVSAS

If you or someone you know is experiencing domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking (DVSAS), support is available. Below is a guide to campus and community resources, their services, and contact information. Understanding the difference between formal resources and strictly confidential options can help you decide what's best for you. You can also find both on-campus and off-campus options in this resource list.

Formal Resources: Provide official actions like investigations, safety measures, or academic accommodations. These resources are required to report incidents to the university, but they still keep your information private and only share it with people involved in responding to the situation.

Strictly Confidential Options: These are private support services where you can share your experience, receive emotional support, and explore your options; without triggering a report to the university. They help with safety planning and understanding your options, but the choice to formally report is entirely up to you.

Formal On-Campus Resources

These resources provide supportive institutional and legal remedies, such as investigations, protective measures, and accommodation. Although they handle victims' information with care and privacy, they are not strictly confidential and are required to report incidents.

Civil Rights and Title IX Office: Ensures compliance with Title IX, investigates reports of sexual harassment, assault, or discrimination, and provides accommodations (e.g., no-contact orders, housing changes, academic adjustments).

LSUS Police Department Criminal Reporting: Responds to safety threats, investigates criminal complaints, and enforces protective orders. After responding to the reports, LSUS Police will notify the Title IX Office.

Sexual Assault and Violence Education (SAVE) Office: This office focuses on prevention initiatives and education to address domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking on campus. While it is not a reporting office, they collaborate closely with Title IX, LSUS Police, and local victim services agencies to support campus safety. Strictly Confidential Options

LSUS Confidential Advisor Team | On-campus: This campus resource consists of LSUS faculty, staff, and administrators who serve as a safe and supportive point of contact for students, faculty, and staff. You can confidentially confide in them for any reason. For concerns related to domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking, these individuals can provide information on available resources, help you find the best options for your needs, assist in accessing support services, or simply offer a trusted and compassionate space to talk.

Confidential advisors receive specialized training on laws and campus policies to support and guide individuals before and during the complaint process. They provide a space to ask questions and receive information without automatically triggering an official report or investigation under PM-73. While they cannot act as a spokesperson, they may attend meetings conducted under PM-73 to assist or consult with students or employees.
